Pick up any edition of SportsBusiness Journal, and odds are good you'll discover Proskauer's sports law group behind the headlines. It's largely because of the firm's long history as a leader in sports law and its talented lineage of attorneys, from the vaunted George Gallanz to David Stern to Gary Bettman. Now led by Leccese, the firm's chairman, and Howard Ganz, the group represents every major sports league and a long list of teams, financiers and other associations in a diverse range of matters.
