TOP 30 LAWYERS

Who are the 30 most influential lawyers in global private equity? We asked the market. Here are the results.

Making the big time as a private equity lawyer is tough. Dealmakers want the transaction process to run as smoothly as possible. When the hunt is on, there is little margin for error, so why risk working with untested legal counsel when you can hire battle-hardened practitioners who have helped you win the day before?

To those legal specialists who sit at the industry's top table, a compelling mix of attributes invariably applies: they tend to be sharp, commercial, great at negotiating terms and even better at working long hours without their attention to detail fading. (It was telling how often those we canvassed for this article pointed to a superhuman propensity for working through the night as one of the reasons why they suggested certain lawyers be included in this article; cold pizza at dawn really does seem to be a staple component of their diet.) Moreover, many of them are also known for their outstanding people skills and can safely be described as 'nice guys' – or girls as the case may be.

The legal practitioners profiled in these pages have all made it to the peak of their profession. After careful deliberation and a multitude of interviews with those who depend on their services, we selected 30 transaction lawyers and fund formation specialists who private equity professionals consider "influential".

All of them have impeccable credentials as advisers, which is to say they are recognised as people who can be relied upon for giving genuine and dependable guidance when it matters most. "He's really in the deal every time and will call me before breakfast to tell me about ideas he's had in the shower about getting it done," commented one GP about why he valued the relationship with his favourite lawyer.

Many of our Top 30 have also been influential as innovators, either in terms of advancing best practice in deal documentation, fund structuring or customer care, or in providing best-in-class legal services to clients in the emerging parts of the private equity world such as Eastern Europe, Asia and Latin America. And many spend substantial portions of their time lobbying politicians and bureaucrats for the greater good of private equity.

In what follows, we present our assortment alphabetically. Be clear that this is no ranking, nor do we make any claims as to it being "comprehensive" in some way, although we did endeavour to include attorneys from around the world.

To produce this selection, our editors quizzed a large crowd of GPs, LPs, bankers and placement agents. Some of our choices may strike you as surprising; others we expect you to agree with unreservedly.

If indeed you feel there are some glaring omissions, please tell us. Again, there was no way for us to capture everyone who matters in this field. Still, we are always very keen to learn more about those people who make a difference in this people-driven asset class. Your feedback will be much appreciated.
