

## Proskauer Advises Church & Dwight on Its Acquisition of Water Pik for Approximately \$1 Billion

July 17, 2017 (New York) – International law firm Proskauer advised longtime client Church & Dwight Co., Inc. (NYSE: CHD) in its definitive agreement to acquire Water Pik, Inc., the market leader in water-jet technology in both oral water flossers and replacement showerheads, for approximately \$1 billion in cash. Water Pik is the number one brand of both water flossers and replacement shower heads in the U.S. The acquisition of the company is Church & Dwight's entrance into the replacement shower head segment.
