
## PROSKAUER ROSE

■ TELL US ABOUT YOUR TOP U.S. SUPREME COURT OR FEDERAL APPEALS COURT VICTORY OVER THE PAST YEAR AND HOW YOU AND YOUR TEAM ACHIEVED THE WIN.

We handled and won nearly a dozen appeals in the U.S. Court of Appeals for the First Circuit over the last year on behalf of the Financial Oversight and Management Board for Puerto Rico, which Congress created to oversee the restructuring of Puerto Rico's crippling debtthe largest municipal restructuring in United States history. Two key wins were Vázquez-Garced v. FOMB and Méndez-Núñez v. FOMB, which upheld the board's authority over budgetary matters against challenges by Puerto Rico's governor and its legislature. We convinced the court that the text and structure of the Puerto Rico Oversight, Management, and Economic Stability Act, the statute designed to address the debt crisis, compelled these outcomes.

- WHAT WAS YOUR FIRM'S KEY TO APPELLATE SUCCESS OVER THE PAST YEAR? On every appeal that requires deep subject-matter knowledge, we carefully staff our cases with both appellate specialists and substantive experts, who collaborate at every stage from outlining the brief to conducting the oral argument.
- WHAT IS THE MOST SATIS-FYING ELEMENT OF APPELLATE PRACTICE, IN YOUR OPINION? There is nothing as rewarding as toiling over an argument in your brief, adjusting and rewriting until you get it just so, and then seeing the court endorse and echo your argument in the written decision.
- WHAT'S THE MOST VALUABLE LESSON YOU LEARNED AS A YOUNG LAWYER? Surround yourself with colleagues from whom you can learn and who are as devoted to both the cases and clients as you are.
